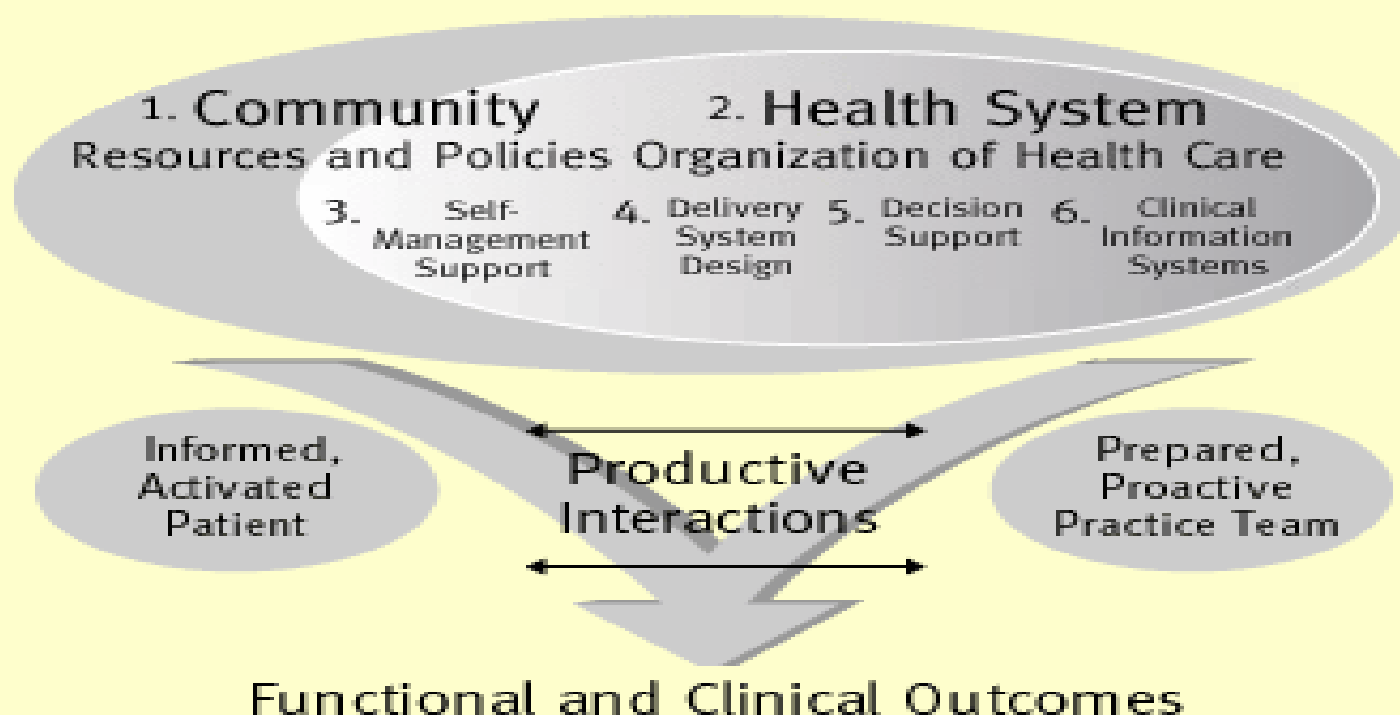

# Family Practice Oncology Network

- Survey of FPs re Cancer management  
Areas identified as of High Interest
- Discussing a Patient Dx
- Dealing with family members
- Follow-up
- PC

# Family Physicians and cancer management

- FPON (Family Practice Oncology Network) to develop
  - Communication tools
  - Evidence-based guidelines
  - Continuing Education Programs/Preceptorship

# Family Physician's role in Patient Navigation?

- Cancer Patients
  - visit FP twice as often as other patients
  - consult FP first rather than cancer centre
  - 36 % unsure who was responsible for F-U
- FPs - want to be involved in all stages of cancer care
  - need to be more proactive supporting patients/families

# Family Physicians perceptions re Navigation

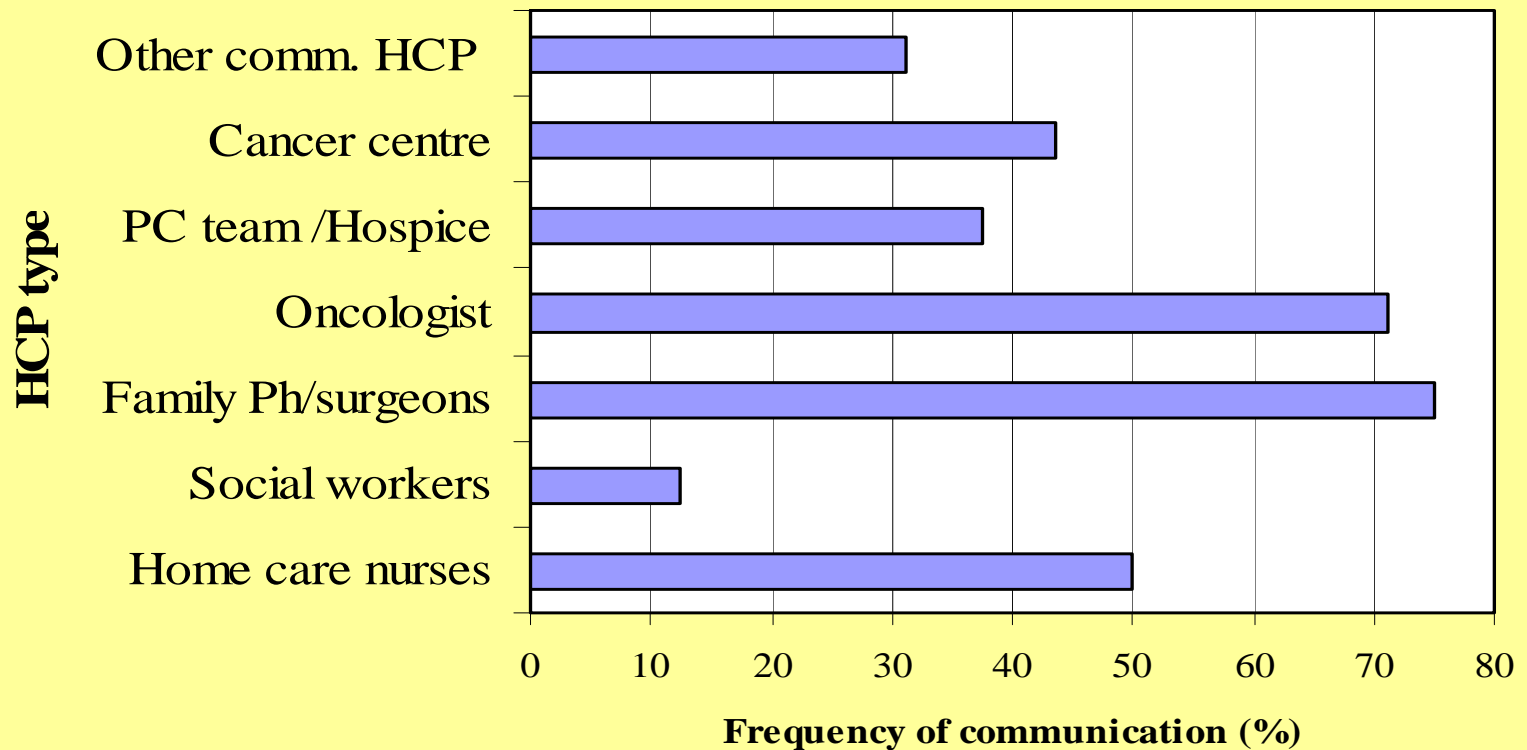
- Adapted the European Society of Medical Oncology Supportive/PC Survey (12 Q)
- Aim: to understand experiences of FPs re: Coordination of care & Navigation role
- Pilot FPs in Kootenays & Northern BC (n=16)

# Questionnaire content

- How often FP connect with other HCP in the community
- What navigation functions FPs assume
- FP needs to fulfill Navigation role

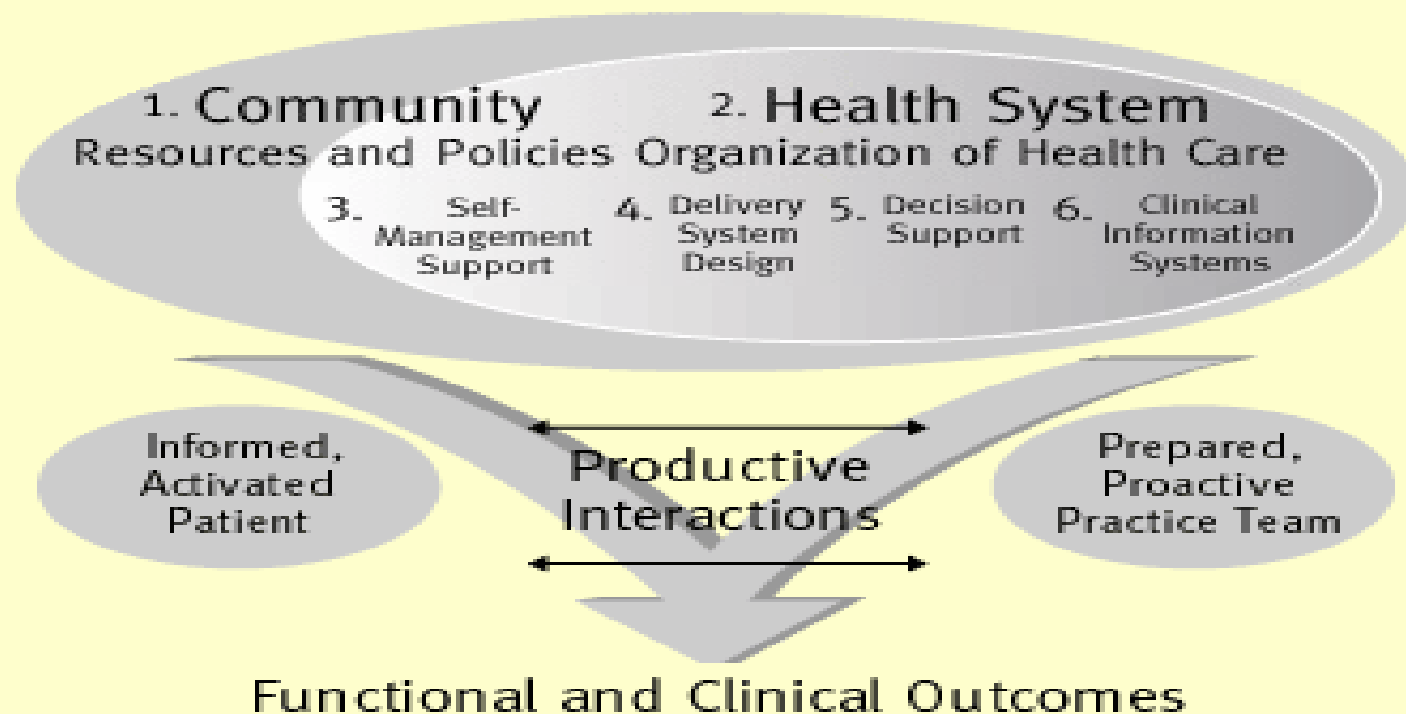
# FP needs for Increased Navigation Role

- Q. To become more involved in providing Navigation for your cancer patients you need

■ Resources	Percentage
■ More time	75
■ Ready access to information & resources	75
■ Enhanced oncology training	69
■ Appropriate financial incentive	44
■ Enhanced training re provision emotional support	38
■ More integration with community cancer team	38
