

# Provincial Virtual Health Fiscal 2023/24 Year in Review





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#### Introduction

The Provincial Digital Health and Information Services (PDHIS) portfolio was formed in July 2022 to digitally and virtually enable our B.C. health system more effectively. The purpose of PDHIS is to deliver timely, reliable and equitable access to trusted information and services that support quality health care delivery and patient outcomes; while continuously innovating and improving our products, services, partner relationships and team culture. Our vision is to advance a quality, learning health system in collaboration with our partners, care providers and patients.

In late 2023, the Office of Virtual Health adopted the new name "Provincial Virtual Health" to reflect the growing scope of our work in the delivery and management of virtual health across Provincial Health Services Authority (PHSA) and the B.C. health sector.

As a valued member of the PDHIS portfolio, Provincial Virtual Health (PVH) owns the delivery and management of virtual health, and provides strategic direction on virtual health initiatives at PHSA and across the health sector.

A distinguishing feature of PVH is the clinical focus we bring to our initiatives, enabled largely by the strong clinical expertise of our team members. PVH works directly with clinical teams in direct-care delivery programs to provide leadership, guidance and support as they integrate virtual health into their services.

Acting as a clinical advocate and voice for our partners, PVH ensures that the needs of health care providers and patients are at the forefront of virtual health solutions. We also collaborate with partners at PHSA and B.C. health authorities to support provincial priorities. We are proud to work in response to patient and provider requests for improved access and experience, along with PHSA's mandate to deliver virtual health, and to clinical programs' increasing priority to deliver more services virtually.

PVH plays a critical role as a facilitator and connector, bridging the gap between patients, providers, and the right teams within PDHIS and provincially. In this way, PVH is transforming the way patients can receive services and information, enabling them to connect with their providers from any place at any time. PVH is promoting the B.C. Digital Health Strategy to advance the goal of a digitally enabled health system trusted by all who use it.

Throughout 2023, PVH was honoured to work with partners at PHSA and across the province on initiatives that support populations identified as priorities by the health sector and Ministry of Health: Indigenous care, primary care, hospital services, seniors care, cancer care, Mental Health and Substance Use Services, and transport. Together we are transforming the health care system and bringing care closer to home.

#### Digital Health and Information Services

During the fiscal 2023-24, a number of team members transitioned from the PVH team to other teams within the PDHIS portfolio. The move aligned the team members more appropriately with the focus of their work. Several projects in this report were initiated with PVH and collaboration continued following the team members' transition to other PDHIS teams. These projects are denoted with an asterisk.

#### **Provincial Virtual Health Leadership Committee**

The Provincial Virtual Health Leadership Committee (PVHLC) aims to address current state challenges by overseeing a provincially coordinated approach to virtual health aligned with provincial strategic objectives. It also aims to improve provincial coordination of virtual health solutions and services integrated within hybrid models of care to deliver value to citizens, caregivers, providers and the health system.

The committee is comprised of executives from the Provincial Virtual Health team and Associate/Assistant Deputy Ministers from the BC Ministry of Health.

#### **Provincial Virtual Health Collaborative**

The Provincial Virtual Health Collaborative (PVHC) is a group with broad representation from across BC's health sector, focused on helping its members stay informed of virtual health priorities and initiatives occurring across the province, and identifying opportunities for provincial collaboration and knowledge sharing. The aim of PVHC is to increase visibility into innovative, novel, or potentially provincially scalable models of care being piloted in local or regional settings and foster active participation in a province-wide learning health system, through the sharing of research, evidence, and outcome data from virtual health initiatives active in different health organizations across the province.

The Collaborative is comprised of senior leaders from health authorities and health entities across the province.
