

## Highlights of changes to the Zoom desktop client (version 5.4.6)

Effective Thursday, February 18, 2021

### Purpose

- This documents highlights the key changes and improvements to the Zoom desktop client version 5.4.6. The previous desktop client version on most health authority computers and laptops was 5.1.3.

### Requirements to receive version 5.4.6

- Updates will be deployed on the evening of February 17, 2021.
- The Zoom application needs to be exited before receiving the updates.
- All PHSA, PHC, and VIHA devices connected to the health authority network will be automatically updated with the Zoom desktop client version 5.4.6.
- If you are working from home, your laptop must be connected to the health authority network via VPN to receive the Zoom desktop client update.

## Virtual health visit features

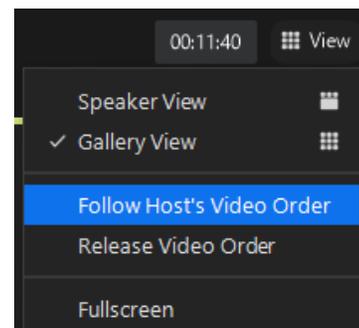
### Custom gallery view for hosts, co-hosts, and participants



Zoom gallery view

- Up to 49 participants are visible in gallery view.
- Host and co-hosts can rearrange the view of meeting participants in **gallery view**.
  - ✓ Click and drag the participant's video square to the position you want in gallery view.

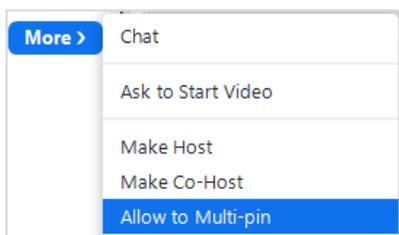
- Host and co-hosts can also choose to push this view to meeting participants, or allow participants to create their own gallery view.
  - ✓ From the **View** menu, click **Follow Host's Video Order** to push the view to all meeting participants.
  - ✓ This layout will remain in place until **Release Video Order** is selected.



## Pin and spotlight participants

### Pin

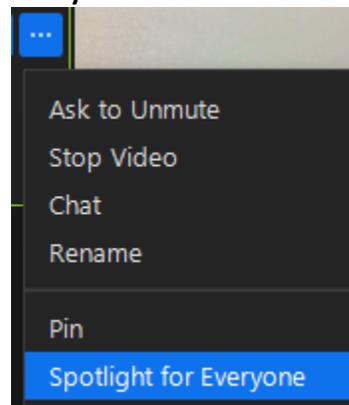
- Allows specific participant to always be visible, even if someone who is not pinned is speaking.
- Only **affects your view**.
- Any participant can pin other participants.
- Participants can now pin up to 9 participants with the host's permission.
  - ✓ Click **Participants** in the meeting toolbar.
  - ✓ Hover over the participant, click **More**, and then **Allow to multi-pin**.

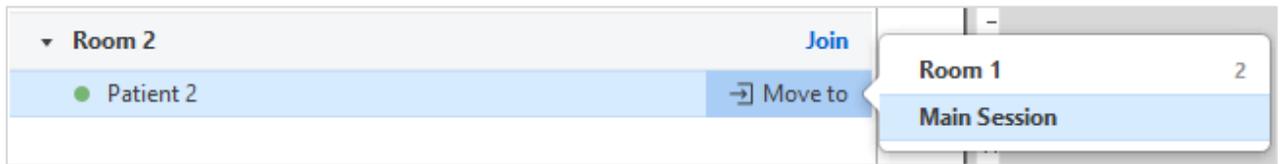
### Spotlight

- Allows a specific participant to always be visible, even if someone else is speaking.
- **Affects all participants** in the meeting.
- Requires **at least 3 participants** in the meeting with their **video on**.
- Only the host and co-host can set up the spotlight.
- The host or co-host can spotlight up to 9 participants, including themselves.
  - ✓ Hover over the participant's video window and click the **3 dots** (⋮)
  - ✓ From the menu, select **Spotlight for Everyone**.



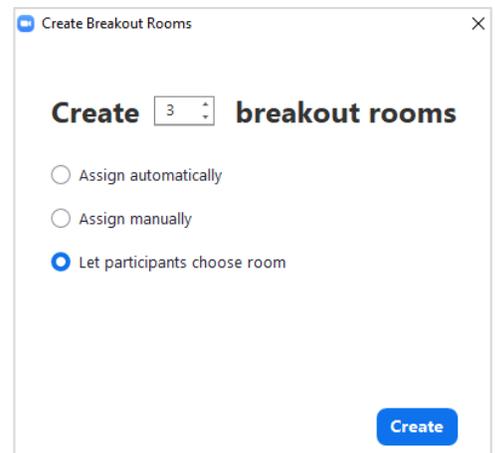
## Breakout Rooms

- Co-hosts now have the same breakout-room controls as the meeting hosts.
- Hosts and co-hosts can assign a participant back to the main session, rather than ending the breakout session.
  - ✓ After opening the breakout rooms, hover over the **participant's name**.
  - ✓ Click **Move to**.
  - ✓ Select **Main Session**.



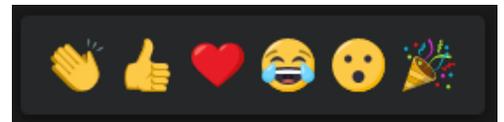
- Pre-assigned attendees joining after the Breakout Rooms have been started will now automatically be assigned to their Breakout Room.

- The host can now create Breakout Rooms with the option for participants to self-select which Breakout Room they would like to join.
  - ✓ Click **Breakout Rooms** from the toolbar.
  - ✓ Adjust the **number of Breakout Rooms** you want to open.
  - ✓ Select the option to **Let participants choose room**
  - ✓ Click **Create**.

Participants can move freely between breakout rooms, without needing the host's help. Both the meeting host and participants need to be on desktop client version 5.3.0 or later to self-select Breakout Rooms.



### Additional meeting reactions

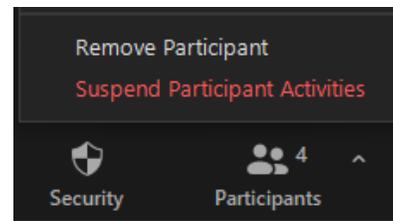
- Meeting participants can now react with a **heart**, **surprised face**, **laughing face**, or **party emoji**. Participants will also need to have the latest version of the Zoom client to see them.



## Virtual health visit security features

### Suspend all participant activities

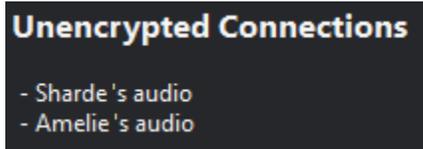
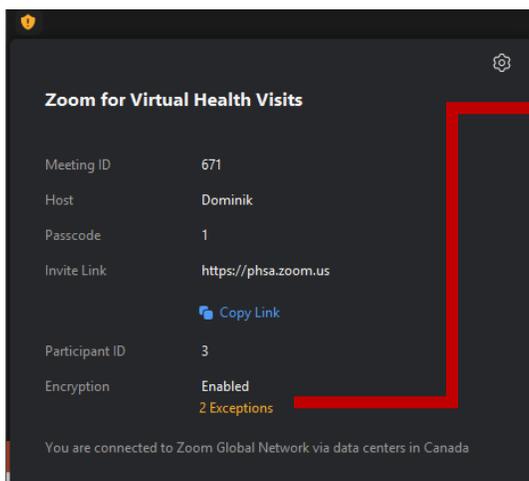
- Hosts and co-hosts can immediately suspend all participant activities from the **Security** option in the meeting toolbar. This will:
  - Mute all video and audio
  - Stop screen sharing
  - End all breakout rooms



### Warnings about partially encrypted meetings



- In the top left corner, a warning will display if a meeting participant's connection cannot be encrypted.
  - ✓ Click the  icon and then **Exceptions** to view unencrypted connections.



**NOTE:** Participants phoning in do not have an encrypted connection.

**Phone connections**, even if unencrypted, still meet our privacy and security standards for virtual health visits with patients. **Confirm the participant's identity before proceeding.**

- If you are unsure about the encryption level of the connection, switch to an alternative method to host your virtual health visit.
  -  = the meeting is encrypted\*
  -  = the meeting is using end-to-end encryption\*
- (\*: both encryption methods meet our security and privacy standards for virtual health visits with patients)
