Mission & Goals

BCEHI aims to create efficient, coordinated, and high-quality processes that **support and encourage multi-jurisdictional human health research**.

The goal is to make BC a more attractive environment for research activity. We have implemented harmonized models that make the ethics review process more timely and efficient and allow researchers to submit a single ethics application, regardless of the number of BC jurisdictions involved in a project.

Harmonization also ensures the consistency and quality of ethics review, in compliance with TCPS-2, across all research ethics boards in BC. Overall, BCEHI will encourage more multi-jurisdictional health research and make BC a more competitive and innovative health research environment.

KEY ACCOMPLISHMENTS

- ⇒ Full acceptance of harmonized models for minimal risk and above minimal risk studies by partner institutions.
- ⇒ Quantified improvements in the research ethics review process, including improved communication between institutions and reduced duplication of effort for researchers, REB members, and support staff.
- ⇒ Creation of common behavioural and clinical research ethics application forms and guidance
- ⇒ Support the development and programming of the Provincial Research Ethics Platform (**PREP**)

Working Groups

The BCEHI Advisory Committee has four working groups and a PREP advisory team:

PREP: Work with the RISe development team at UBC to design, test, and implement the provincial platform for harmonized ethical review and approval

Education: Develop materials and processes for education of research community about BCEHI and PREP processes; templates and common forms

Advisory Committee


Communications: Provide admin support to the Committee; Implement Communications Strategy; Promotional materials; Social Media and Website updates Evaluation: 'Measures and assesses' to illustrate successes and challenges through qualitative and quantitative means; continual improvement

Outreach: Works with stakeholders to present the BCEHI and it's content to the greater research community; Finding potential partners; Creates collaborative projects using the expertise within the Committee membership

Success In Numbers

- \Rightarrow 73 harmonized studies approved in the first half of 2017
- \Rightarrow Of those studies, **4 were above minimal risk**
- \Rightarrow On average, studies were approved in 36 business days

Provincial Research Ethics Platform (PREP) Launch

MSFHR provided additional funding to the BCEHI in the Fall of 2016 to support the BCEHI partner organizations with ongoing management and sustainability of the BCEHI as well as the development of a shared technology platform for harmonized ethics review. The anticipated launch phase of the platform is Spring 2018.

Reciprocity Agreement Update

The BC Research Ethics Review Reciprocity Agreement was signed by all partner institutions in 2013 and provides the framework for the BCEHI. This agreement is set to terminate in April 2018 and the partners have chosen to re-enter negotiations to update some of the terms so they are in line with current practices and goals. This may involve including new partners in BC that are interested in joining the BCEHI efforts.

Removing Barriers to Research

The vision for the BCEHI continues to be one of collaboration, and working relationships with the goal being coordinated, efficient, and high quality research ethics review processes that support and encourage multi-jurisdictional human health research. The past year has resulted in several milestones being met that continue to demonstrate the effectiveness of this vision, and its ability to make BC a more attractive environment for research activity. We are looking forward to finding a permanent home for BCEHI, and the continued development of the platform, PREP.
