“We are on the right track. We must keep going.”

Modelling informs next steps for B.C.

- Earlier today, Provincial Health Officer (PHO) Dr. Bonnie Henry and Health Minister Adrian Dix held a technical briefing and subsequent [news conference](#) during which they shared detailed [epidemiological modelling](#) informed by PHSA's Data Analytics Research and Evaluation (DARE) team and the BCCDC.
- The modelling captures trends to date and explores different scenarios going forward related the number of COVID-19 cases B.C. might see and what impact that might have on critical care capacity depending on the rate and extent of relaxation of physical distancing and other societal restrictions currently in place.
- Overall, Dr. Henry stated that physical distancing measures are succeeding at flattening the curve in B.C., but we need to continue to hold the course or we risk seeing another surge.
- It was suggested that provincially, we may look at gradually restarting some scheduled surgeries in mid-May.
- Going forward, the province will move away from looking at models based on scenarios in other countries, such as China or Italy, as we now have more data available from B.C.
- The PHO stressed that we need to find a balance between allowing the economy and health care system continue to function and preventing further transmission, and that we won't be returning to the "old normal" any time soon, rather B.C. will be looking at a more gradual reintroduction that allows for physical distancing, potentially over the next 12-18 months.

More online options for students to support social, emotional well-being

- Today, the [B.C. government announced](#) new, free virtual educational programs for students, parents and educators are supporting social and emotional well-being as part of navigating the new world of remote learning during the COVID-19 pandemic.
- The free, virtual WE Well-being program was recently launched as part of the new WE Schools @home program.
- Accessible for grades K-12 in both English and French, the program is aimed at youth who are experiencing anxiety and social isolation. It places a special emphasis on WE Well-being online learning, including social-emotional learning and resiliency.

Canada-US border to remain closed

- Prime Minister Trudeau [announced today](#) that Canada and the United States have agreed to extend the current closure of the border to all non-essential travel for at least another month as the fight against COVID-19 continues in both countries.
- Travel restrictions across the Canada-U.S. border took effect on March 21. That agreement exempted the flow of trade and commerce, as well as essential health care workers who live and work on opposite sides of the border. Set to last 30 days, terms of the arrangement were due to expire on April 21. The extension will see these restrictions remain in place for another 30 days.

B.C. launches COVID-19 data dashboard

- [A new, interactive dashboard](#) featuring the latest numbers about COVID-19 launched this week.
- The dashboard provides an overview of testing and case information throughout the province including total case counts, case counts by health authority, numbers of people who are in hospital, in the ICU, who have died and recovered. It is a collaboration between PHSA, BCCDC and the Ministry of Health.

B.C. COVID-19 Digital Assistant answers questions from the public

- The B.C. COVID-19 digital assistant is a friendly chatbot that has taken up residence [on the BCCDC website](#) to help answer questions from members of the public.
- It was built to assist with the significant demand for public information, as a collaboration between BCCDC, Ministry of Health and PHSA's IMITS and Communications teams. It has answered more than 500,000 questions in just over a week!
- The 'bot' provides directions to the latest publicly available information about COVID-19 on the BCCDC and B.C. government websites. It simulates human conversations using natural language processing and machine learning. New responses are being added to it continuously, and the more questions that are asked of it, the more accurate its responses are. It will be added to other websites over time, as its knowledge base grows.
