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## Supplementary Health Status Questionnaire for Phalloplasty

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During the surgical procedure, the surgeons will remove a flap from your forearm consisting of skin, nerves, veins, and an artery. Once the flap is positioned on the pubis, the veins and the artery of the flap will be connected to the veins and the artery located in the groin (inguinal fold). The connection of these vessels will ensure adequate blood supply, allowing the flap of skin to heal properly. Where blood supply is inadequate, complications can arise, such as the partial or total loss of the flap that will form the phallus.

Some medical tests can help us identify a condition that may affect blood supply required to heal the phallus. Your surgeon will ask you about your medical and health history to determine if further preoperative examinations are necessary.
