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Updates and Reminders:

1. End of 2023/24 Respiratory Season

On April 8, the Office of the Provincial Health Officer along with the Ministry of Health announced the <u>end</u> to the 2023/24 respiratory season in British Columbia.

Given the decreased rates of viral respiratory infections in the community, some of the additional infection prevention and control measures implemented in fall 2023 will no longer be required at all times but may be required as part of routine additional precautions and/or in accordance with point-of-care risk assessments.

Each clinical program will roll out these changes over the next few weeks so watch for more information in your clinical program bulletin, where appropriate.

3. BEACON Medical Leadership Program off to a Strong Start

On March 5 & 6, the inaugural cohort of the BEACON medical leadership program had their first in-person sessions. The modules focused on grounding participants in foundational leadership knowledge, including understanding settler colonialism's impact on healthcare and promoting culturally safe, anti-racist, person-centered care.

The March module emphasized aligning personal growth with a system-wide understanding of PHSA's role within the healthcare landscape, including its coordination with government and other partners.

The next module will delve into team dynamics within healthcare settings, continuing to integrate Coast Salish teachings. BEACON, the first program of its kind within PHSA, aims to equip emerging leaders with the skills to bring the PHSA vision and North Star priorities to life.

4. PHSA Physician Quality Improvement (PQI) Applied Training Program

Applications to the PHSA Physician Quality Improvement (PQI) Applied Training program for Fall 2024 are now open!

In partnership with the Specialist Services Committee, the PHSA PQI program provides in-depth QI training with the goal of developing physician and medical staff leaders in the field QI. Over the span of a year, participants will attend seven full-day (or equivalent) sessions and receive support from the PHSA

PQI technical team to complete a QI project. Physicians will be compensated unless otherwise paid for time attending the learning sessions and completing project work.

ELIGIBLITY AND REQUIREMENTS

Eligible participants are physicians and medical staff who practice at PHSA programs including BCCH, BCWH, BCC, BCCDC, BCEHS, and BCMHSUS. PQI will also accept dyad partners with the primary physician applicant as participants in the program.

Attendance and participation in the program learning sessions is required for completion of the program. The sessions will consist of a mix of in-person or virtual sessions, and will be held on the following dates:

- Learning session #1: Friday, September 20, 2024
- Learning session #2: Friday, October 25, 2024
- Learning session #3: Friday, November 22, 2024
- Learning session #4: Thursday, January 23, 2025 (half day) & January 24, 2025 (half day) *timing to be confirmed
- Learning session #5: Friday, February 28, 2025
- Learning session #6: Friday, April 4, 2025
- Learning session #7: Friday, May 9, 2025

COSTS AND COMPENSATION

Participation in the program is free of charge. Physicians and medical staff who are not already remunerated through existing service agreements will be supported through compensated time to attend learning sessions and undertake project work (up to a maximum number of hours over the course of a year).

5. Women's Leadership Forum
