Survey: Current Global Practices of Post-stroke Cognitive Screening

Post-stroke cognitive impairment is a significant, yet often overlooked, cause of persistent disability, affecting over one-third of stroke survivors. However, we have limited knowledge about global practices and barriers in screening for cognitive impairment among survivors.

This survey, led by members of the World Stroke Organization Future Stroke Leaders Programme, including Ismália De Sousa, a member of the SSBC Executive Stroke Steering Committee, seeks to address this gap.


