ICU Patient and Family Centered Rounds

If you or a family member have been admitted to Intensive Care, please consider the opportunity to participate in Patient and Family Centered Rounds.

The goal of Patient and Family Centered Rounds is to increase comfort, encourage participation, and shared decision making between patients, families, and the care team.

Interior Health is committed to patients and families. Intensive Care Units include patients and families into the circle of care and welcome them to daily rounds.



Rounds – what are they?

Once per day, the interdisciplinary team (physicians, nurses, respiratory therapists, dieticians, physiotherapists, social work, etc.) gather as a group to review each patient's status and care plan.

Rounds may include:

- A physical exam
- A summarized patient history
- Review/update of the patient's chart
- Tests may be ordered
- Ongoing care is discussed

Patient and Family Centered Rounds – what are they?

Patients and families are invited to daily rounds. Rounds will take place at a specified time each day at, or near, the patient's bedside. We encourage you to attend and welcome your care questions.

You can expect to be introduced to the care team and there will be time provided near the end of rounds for questions. Patients and family members may be asked questions throughout rounds concerning the patient's baseline status or current experience. Note taking is encouraged.

How Do I Find Out About Rounds?

On admission to one of our Intensive Care Units, information will be provided about Patient and Family Centered Rounds. Please feel free to ask if this information has not yet been provided to you.

Important points include:

- Time of rounds
- Where to meet
- What to expect
