Updates and Reminders:

1. Recruitment Underway for Chief Medical Officer Positions at both BC Women's Hospital and BC Children's Hospital

With PHSA's clinically focused mandate now clearly articulated, recruitment has begun for permanent chief medical officer positions at both BC Children's Hospital and BC Women's Hospital + Health Centre. These positions represent an important opportunity to help shape the future of care, clinical excellence and medical leadership across the C&W campus.

While both positions are now posted, recruitment will be phased, with the search for the BC Women's chief medical officer proceeding first, followed by recruitment for BC Children's. This approach will help maintain medical leadership continuity across the campus throughout the transition. To support this work, an executive search firm has been engaged to assist with recruitment.

2. Clarifying PHSA's Future Role as a Provincial Provider of Specialized Clinical Care

As mentioned in the [all-staff bulletin sent on August 12*](#), the Ministry of Health has endorsed recommendations in defining PHSA's future role as a provincial provider of specialized clinical care and clarifying the services that BC Shared Health Services (BCSHS) will deliver.

With government's decision to refine PHSA's mandate, PHSA will shift from providing a number of services on behalf of other health authorities to becoming a client of BCSHS for some non-clinical services. In the months ahead, leaders will assess the implications of this evolution to ensure clarity on priorities across PHSA's specialized programs with a sharp focus on improving health outcomes.

As previously [announced by BCSHS interim president & CEO Tiffany Ma*](#), BCSHS will design an operating model and lead transition planning to assume these services in 2027:

- BC Renal (including PROMIS)
- Cardiac Services BC (including PRISM)
- Health Improvement Networks
 - Child Health BC
 - Critical Care BC
 - Cystic Fibrosis Care BC
 - Emergency Care BC
 - Pain Care BC
 - PICNet
 - Perinatal Services BC
 - Stroke Services BC
 - Trauma Services BC
- Cochlear Implant planning
- The Provincial Medical Imaging Office

- Provincial pharmacy system planning and design responsibilities
- Student Practice Education (including HSPnet)
- Health Emergency Management BC (HEMBC) planning and coordination responsibilities

From the Provincial Clinical Planning Programs and Partnerships (PCPPP) portfolio, Trans Care BC and BC Transplant will remain within PHSA because of their close integration with specialized clinical services, while continuing to work in partnership with BCSHS. HEMBC's disaster psychosocial supports program will also remain within PHSA, alongside the Retinal Disease Treatment Program.

Thank you to medical staff for your ongoing commitment to our patients, families and communities, and for the professionalism and dedication you continue to demonstrate as we shape the next chapter of PHSA together.

3. Update on the Resident Doctors of BC Collective Agreement

The Health Employers Association of BC and Resident Doctors of BC have updated their collective agreement for the period April 1, 2025 to March 31, 2029. The agreement includes a range of changes designed to better support resident physicians throughout their training, with a focus on compensation, workplace protections, health and wellness, and leave provisions.

Highlights include wage and call pay increases, support for educational and exam-related expenses, enhanced health and safety commitments, expanded leave entitlements, and additional employment protections. Together, these changes aim to improve the resident experience by promoting a safer, more inclusive learning and working environment.

6. New Provincial Practice Guidance for Staff Providing Services to People Who Use Substances

The BC Centre for Disease Control and First Nations Health Authority have recently published a [Harm Reduction Manual](#)* for staff, including medical staff, who provide services to people who use substances. It aims to support the delivery of high-quality harm reduction services across a range of health and social service settings and across the system of substance use care.

The manual was developed over several years and brings together best practice guidance. It is available online and will be updated regularly to ensure it stays current and useful for everyday practice.
