4. Medical Staff Wellness and Learning Rounds Launching 2026

Medical Staff Wellness and Learning Rounds is a new presentation and discussion series hosted by PHSA Medical and Academic Affairs in partnership with Doctors of BC. Beginning in 2026, these virtual and in-person sessions will bring together diverse speakers from across the province to explore issues affecting medical staff wellbeing, safety, and practice. Participants can also earn CME credits through applied, practice-focused learning.

The first session, Neurodiversity at Work presented by PHSA's Psychological Health & Safety team, will focus on how to build a stronger, more inclusive team that improves both workplace dynamics and the care provided.

During this session, participants will review and discuss neurodiversity and its relevance in the workplace, including the range of neurodivergent conditions and their implications for diversity and inclusion. The session will also focus on recognizing and addressing barriers to inclusion through psychological safety and practical strategies that support diverse cognitive, learning, and communication styles. Participants will explore a strengths-based leadership approach that leverages neurodiversity to enhance collaboration, innovation, and overall team performance.

5. New Genome BC Genomics Education Modules Support NP Practice

The <u>Nurse Practitioner Education in Genomics</u> (NP-EDGE) online resource is the first initiative in Canada to weave genomics into NP practice and training. Designed to maximize flexibility for learners, the resource begins with a foundational <u>Genetics 101</u> section, followed by a variety of standalone 'scaffolding' modules that NPs can explore at their own pace. Detailed modules include hereditary cancer, Indigenous health, mental health, and ethics.

The content is intended for practicing nurse practitioners and students, with a clinical focus on genetic services currently available in B.C. and how to support patients in practice.

Development of this education resource was funded by Genome BC and individual module completion certificates are available for continuing education.

6. We Are the Change We Seek: Leading Indigenous Health in British Columbia

The UBC Faculty of Medicine's Office of Respectful Environments, Equity, Diversity & Inclusion (REDI) is hosting an upcoming <u>Indigenous Speaker Series</u> featuring Joe Gallagher - k'wunəmen, vice president of Indigenous Health and Cultural Safety, PHSA along with Indigenous vice presidents from Fraser Health, Island Health and Interior Health.

They will share how Indigenous leadership is transforming health systems across B.C.—advancing Cultural Safety, Humility, and Truth and Reconciliation.
