How to Access SPR Data

1. Complete the SPR Surgeon Request Access Form found on the SPR public website.

3. HA SPR Administrator will submit your completed Request form to SPR Central Office. SPR Central Office will assign your SPR access and e-mail you when complete.
4. Log into your Health Authority / hospital intranet with your usual HA Username and Password.

The purpose of the program is to provide complete information for surgeons, hospitals and the Ministry of Health Services for the people of BC. The BC Surgical Patient Registry is a joint program of the Provincial Health Services Authority (PHSA) and the Ministry of Health Services.

The majority of Data for the Surgical Patient Registry is automatically received from each health authority. Patient priority for surgery is identified through condition and diagnosis descriptions that are submitted by the Surgeon on

The SPR data platform uses sophisticated software tools to perform in-depth analysis and create specialized reports and dashboards for different stakeholder groups. The goal of this reporting system is to provide the BC Health Authorities, the BC Ministry of Health, surgeons, and provincial programs with the appropriate data to facilitate development of province-wide standardized measures and wait time management for GI Endoscopy and surgical performance.
